



CULINARY GUIDE



Dolmades(doul-MA-thes) (6 for \$5.00)

Tender grape leaves stuffed with seasoned rice.

Greek Salad (\$5.00)

Crispy lettuce, ripe red tomatoes and cool cucumbers garnished with feta cheese, Greek olives, onions, peppers and a tangy Greek dressing.

Gyros (YEE-rows) (\$10.00)

Seasoned meat roasted and served on Pita bread, topped with a tzatziki sauce, diced tomatoes, lettuce and onions.

Souvlaki (sue-VLAH-kee) (\$10.00)

A sizzling skewer of tender chicken breast or pork marinated with herbs of Mediterranean origin and cooked over an open flame.

Pastichio (pa-STEE-cho) (\$10.00)

Layers of imported Greek Pasta, grated cheese, and sautéed ground beef topped with a cream sauce (béchamel) and baked.

Moussaka (mouh-sa-KA) (\$10.00)

Layers of eggplant and sautéed ground beef topped with a rich cream sauce (béchamel) and baked.

Yahni (yah-NEE) (\$3.00)

Tender string beans simmered with tomatoes, onions and Greek herbs.

Pilaf (\$3.00)

Greek rice made with onions and Greek herbs.

Spanakopita (spa-na-KO-pee-ta) (\$3.00)

A blend of spinach, cheeses and herbs wrapped in buttered fillo dough.

Tiropita (tee-roh-pee-ta) (\$3.00)

Blended cheeses wrapped in buttered fillo dough.

Loukániko (lou-kah-knee-ko) (2 links for \$10.00) is the common Greek word for pork sausage, flavored with orange peel, fennel seed, and other dried herbs.

Baklava (bahk-lah-VA) (\$3.00 or 4 for \$12.00)

Chopped walnuts and cinnamon-sugar between layers of fillo pastry dough baked to a golden brown and drenched with a honey syrup.

Ergolavi (erh-go-LA-vi) (\$3.00)

An almond cookie, baked to golden brown and sprinkled with toasted almonds. Also available with apricot or cherry preserve filling.

Finikia (fee-NEE-kia) (\$3.00)

Country style Greek cookies dipped in honey and topped with crushed walnuts.

Galaktoboureko (ga-lak-to-BOOR-ree-ko) (\$4.00)

Delicately flavored custard baked in fillo pastry topped with a delicate honey syrup.

Kataifi (ka-ta-EE-fee) (\$3.00)

Chopped nuts wrapped in a shredded dough, brushed with melted butter, baked, and smothered with a honey syrup.

Koulourakia (kou-lou-RA-kia) (10 for \$10.00)

Greek butter cookies, a favorite companion with coffee or tea.

Kourambiedes (kou-ram-BEH-des) (\$3.00)

Light buttered cookies sprinkled with confectionery sugar

Loukoumades (lou-kou-MA-des) (Large for \$9.00 or Small for \$6.00)

Fluffy and light puffs, served warm with a honey syrup and sprinkled with cinnamon.

Pastes (PAS-tes) (\$4.00)

Three layers of Grecian cake, two layers of whipped cream, assorted fruit & chocolate flavor.

Baklava Cheesecake (\$5.00)

Cheesecake with a baklava topping.

Tours of the House of Worship

Tours of the House of Worship are scheduled during the festival hours at designated times on Thursday through Sunday. Guides will offer lectures which will describe the history of Orthodoxy which traces its origin to the day of Pentecost. The parish of Saints Constantine and Helen Greek Orthodox Cathedral was established by the early immigrants in 1917. Since that time, the Cathedral has been woven into the fabric of Richmond. Learn, about the Orthodox Christian Church by taking the tour and listening to the lecture. The tour schedule is posted at the entrance of the House of Worship.
